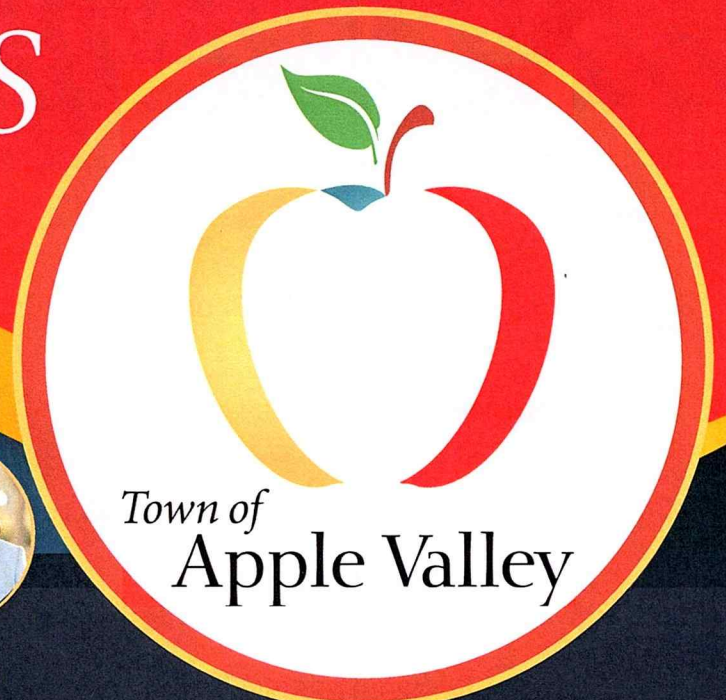

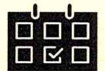

We accept home-generated sharps like needles and lancets in approved containers.

What we DON'T take

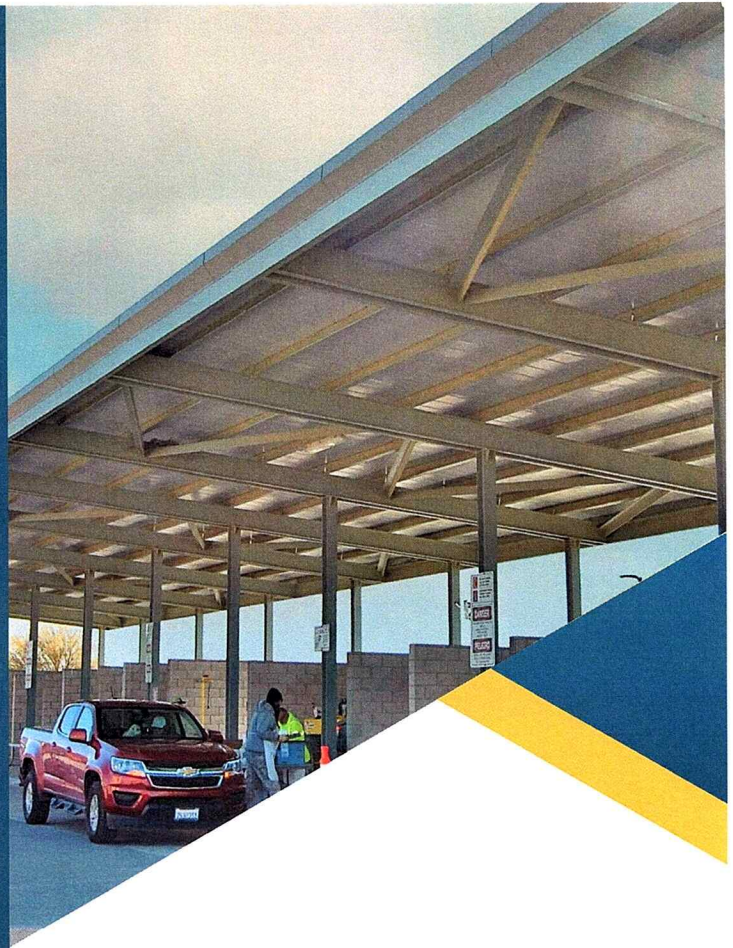

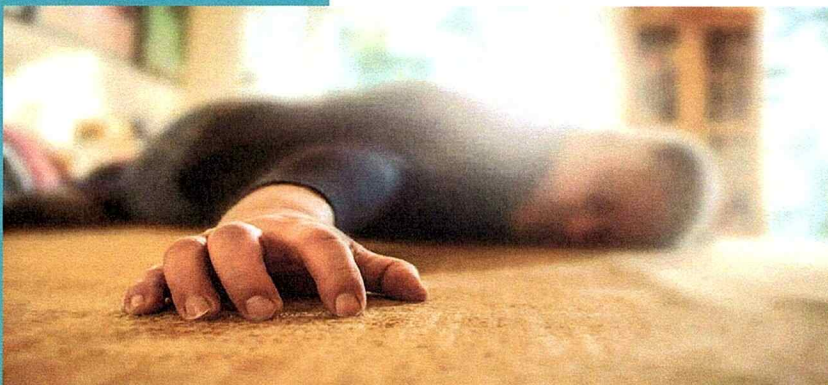

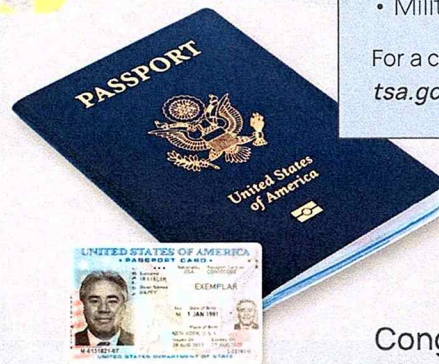

Both a passport book and card are **REAL ID** alternatives.



DOMESTIC FLIGHTS

A passport book or card can be used as alternatives to a state-issued **REAL ID** for domestic travel.



PORTS-OF-ENTRY

The passport book is valid for international travel by air, sea, or land. The passport card is only valid for land and sea.

Replacing Your Passport After A Disaster



When you return home after a major disaster, you may find that your valid passport was lost or damaged. The Disaster Recovery Reform Act of 2018 allows applicants to replace the lost passport, for free, for certain eligible disasters. If eligible, you can apply through the mail.

What you need to submit:

1. DS-5504 (Replacement Passport Form)
2. New Passport Photo
3. DS-64 (Lost/Stolen Passport Form)
4. If expedited service is requested - \$60 expedite fee

The DS-64 form must include:

- Name of the Disaster - For example: "Hurricane Ida"
- Address of the residence where the loss occurred
- Approximate date when the loss occurred
- A statement that the replacement passport fees will not be reimbursed by other sources, such as a homeowner's insurance policy.

Need your passport replacement quickly?

If you need your passport quickly, due to urgent travel in 2 weeks or less, you must apply in person at a passport agency or center. The \$60 expedite fee cannot be waived under the Disaster Recovery Reform Act.

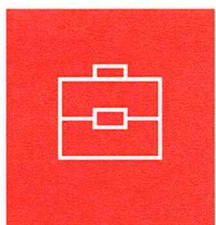

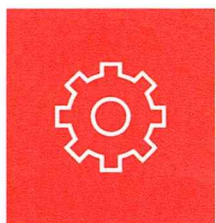
